It was very impactful for our team to hear and see the different classes and homes of some of our brothers and sisters. We drove by many temples and mosques, then we drove into the rougher parts of the city and by a slum called Kibera. Kibera is viewed as "the biggest, largest and poorest slum in Africa". We saw many men, women, and even some young boys strung out on jet fuel and a leaf they chew that gives them a high; while driving near the slum. (Please note that we did not go into the slum due to safety reasons)
