We are so excited to announce that we have received our church registration. That means in the eyes of the Kenyan government we are officially a church. This helps us get more settled in, and are now able to open bank accounts and our team is able to apply for missionary visas and not have to leave every 5 months for a new visa. *Below are a few pictures of our team and our first Sunday in the building. Thats not the only thing that is exciting; We worshipped in our building for the first time on Sunday! We have also hired a Media/Tech and Outreach leader (Phinoshey); to help lead ministries we are continuing to develop. It was an amazing experience to be able to reflect on what God has done in the 7 months we have been on the ground and see how God is using us to reach this city!





We are getting closer to being able to open Mercy House. We are all so excited and eagerly waiting. We are still waiting on the NGO (non-governmental organization) to be established and for the building to be completed. We were hopeful that the NGO would be establish this month and that the building would have been completed at the end of February. Neither of these things happened. Please continue to pray for both so that we can open our doors to the women and children that we are ready to serve and show the love of Christ.

While we are waiting on those two things, we are working diligently on everything that we can. We have started the interview process for some of the women. We have an intense intake process to ensure that the women are ready for the strict program. We have finished step one in the interview process. This is what intake looks like for Mercy House.

I apologize that there are not any pictures for Mercy House this month. I hope that the next newsletter is filled with photos as we open our doors.


TORI'S PERSONAL UPDATE
