



There were tenants lined up to move in on July 1. On June 29, they decided to cancel their lease. It is time to put my house back on the market and start the process of showings all over again. I know that God is in control and has a plan. He will faithfully provide the way that He has with everything else along this journey to Kenya. Our team is very spread out right now as we are making our transitions to Kenya in waves. I am so thankful that technology is allowing us to stay connected. Our team has been going through some struggles and we are encouraging and praying each other through it. The Waruhius had a hospital visit soon after they arrived in Kenya for their daughter Anaiya. Then the Kohman family had 2 hospital visits in Raleigh. One visit was for Lee as she hit her head after passing out and needed staples. Another visit was for their 4 year old daughter Talitha breaking her collarbone.

I have also felt my lower back pain ramping back up during all the moving. I have 4 bulging discs in my lower back that I will most likely need surgery for in the future. I've already had 2 rounds of cortisone injections in my spine in 2022. The goal is to prolong surgery as long as possible through physical therapy. I am asking for prayers that my back will recover without a need for more injections.
