WHAT IS GOD TEACHING ME?

We have officially been publicly launched as a church for over 100 days now. Time is flying! In that time there have been 5 baptisms, 4 salvations during service, and over 100 salvations during outreach. It is amazing to see how much God is already working in such a short amount of time. We look forward to watching God save the lost in the city of Nairobi. Our vision is to see a gospel awakening in Nairobi that is carried to the ends of the earth. We know that this vision can only happen with the help of the Holy Spirit. He can do it!



Caleb and I began hosting a family group on Wednesday nights. The church currently has two family groups and our goal is to have 20 family groups by the time Mercy Nairobi Church is 5 years old. Please continue to pray that current members will prioritize building community with other believers. Please also pray that recurring attenders will become members and join a family group.



There has been some sadness and challenges with Mercy House this month. At the beginning of the month, one of our residents decided to leave. Each woman we serve is an adult with free will and can make the decision to leave. This was especially difficult for me and Victoria, because two of her children were in Mercy House Preschool. I left on Monday after teaching five kids and came back on Tuesday to teach three kids. It was very abrupt. She is currently asking for forgiveness and wanting to return.

Please pray for leadership to have wisdom and clarity on what her consequences should be, what her plan should look like, and how Christ would treat her. Please pray for her (Resident A.) to have motivation to follow expectations and complete her plan. Our biggest mission with Mercy House is to share the Gospel with each woman and child. Please pray that this will be a Gospel opportunity, not only for her, but also for the other residents and children at Mercy House.



Mercy House Preschool has been going well. We've officially been up and running for a month. We are having Bible story time everyday following by a corresponding coloring sheet. The kids are really enjoying learning about Moses. One mother even told us that her daughter is telling her the Bible story after school each day.

We've also seen tremendous improvements in other areas including social skills, attention span, English knowledge, and following directions. We had our first parent teacher conferences and it was so encouraging to hear that all the mothers are grateful for preschool and have seen improvements in their children. It is such a joy knowing that these women trust me to help raise their children.

PERSONAL UPDATE


