WHAT IS GOD TEACHING US? Caleb


And whatever else you get, get understanding." This month, I have been asking God for wisdom because we are called to seek God's words, treasure His commands, and apply our hearts to His understanding.

I have been learning how to mark repeated/key words and ask questions about those words. I have also enjoyed learning where there are references to things from the Old Testament. The Gospel is also repeated over and over in Romans which is such a great reminder. God is our Creator and has revealed His authority to all of us through creation, Scripture, and other ways. We are all sinners and have made mistakes that separate us from God. But Jesus lived a perfect life without making a single mistake and died on the cross as a sacrifice for our sins. Jesus rose from the dead three days later to show that He was fully God. We can't do ANYTHING to earn God's love, but He has given us the gift of Jesus. All we have to do is confess our sins to Him and believe in Christ's sacrifice. AMAZING!

"The righteousness of God is through faith in Jesus Christ to all who believe, since there is no distinction. For all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God. They are justified freely by his grace through the redemption that is in Christ Jesus. God presented him as an atoning sacrifice in his blood, received through faith to demonstrate his righteousness, because in his restraint God passed over the sins previously committed. God presented him to demonstrate his righteousness at the present time so that he would be righteous and declare righteous the one who has faith in Jesus." ~Romans 3:22-26



A lot has happened with Mercy Nairobi in the month of February. Our numbers are continuing to grow!

A young adults ministry has been started for all attendees ages 18-35. We had a young adults game night one Saturday night this month. It was a lot of fun to play games, enjoy fellowship, and laugh as we got to know people better.

The youth (ages 12-18) numbers are also growing for our Sunday gatherings. They are starting to meet once as a month as we build the youth program for the church. We talked to a few teenagers after their first gathering and they loved it and had a great time.

Our kids ministry has grown from 3 classrooms to 4 as we are having more kids come to church. We also have added another family group to show growth from 2 family groups to 3 family groups.

The family group that Caleb and I host has not had a leader for a few months. We have just been rotating who leads each week. After a few weeks of prayer, I have felt the Holy Spirit prompting me to lead our group. I have talked with Allan and am now the leader for our group. I am nervous but I know that God can use me to serve our church body.

We do the same story two days in a row. Victoria will tell them the story in Swahili the first day and then I tell them the story in English the second day. I've also been able to use more English lately and they are understanding.

WEST NAIROBI SCHOOL



During our Professional Development mini-sessions and conversations with other professionals, I have learned about how to utilize AI in my planning and lessons. These new methods have helped me make unique and fun activities. I have continued to have opportunities to disciple two young men throughout the week. We are having great gospel-centered conversations and discussing life events.

One fun theme that keeps popping up in my classes is how every man and woman is created in God's image (Genesis 1:27). This theme has helped us discuss the evil that Nazi Germany propagated against multiple people groups, discuss slavery throughout history, and discuss issues that my students are facing today from a biblical perspective. In all of these topics, we can look at how humans are sinning as they destroy and discriminate against the image-bearers of God. This topic has also allowed me to remind my students that they are "fearfully and wonderfully made."

The chart to the left represents support during Caleb's time at West Nairobi School. The blue figures represent commitments and the light figures represent what is still needed.


Currently, there are <u>8 of the 16 (62%)</u> needed supporters that have made commitments. We are excited to see what God has planned for the other 8 or more.
